Massimo Cristaldi is a visual artist whose work meditates on the friction between the impermanence of human traces and the relentless stratification of time. His research is not confined to a single subject but explores the marks of history in all their forms. From the tangible scars of human intervention on the landscape to the shifting identities in our societies, from the intimate silence of unfinished architecture to the monumental wounds of contemporary events, Massimo's gaze seeks the point where the past overlaps with an uncertain present. Moving beyond traditional documentation, he adopts a subtractive approach. By isolating the essential elements of the landscape, he strips reality of its daily noise to reveal a 'suspended' atmosphere, where the human presence explicit or implied —drives the narrative. His photography has been recognised globally, receiving awards such as the Travel Photographer of the Year, and is held in prestigious permanent collections, including the George Eastman House (Rochester, USA). He is the author of the monograph Suspended. His background in a highly structured professional field informs his artistic methodology, bringing a disciplined sense of order and essential form to his exploration of time and memory.

I have always been drawn to what remains. Perhaps it is a reflection of my roots, but I perceive reality as the result of a continuous stratification of time. In a world consumed by speed and increasing homogeneity, I see the photograph not merely as an image, but as a physical object that serves as a sharp demarcation line between Past and Future. It is the incarnation of the present moment—a tangible boundary that separates what was from what will be—yet another, frozen layer of time.

My practice oscillates between two frequencies. There is the meditative silence of my landscape work, where I suspend time to reveal the invisible weight of history. And there is the intuitive flow of the street, where I surrender to the rhythm of life. I do not hunt for images; I prepare myself to receive them. I am not interested in the chaotic surface of things, but in their underlying structure. Whether facing a landscape or the human condition, my photography is a continuous inquiry into limits. I explore the dualisms that define our reality: light and darkness, zero and one, presence and absence. It is an attempt to give permanence to the fragile traces we leave behind.
